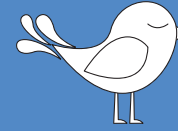

Bird - Vocabulary

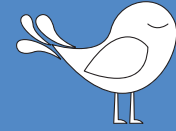


cage: a structure of bars or wires in which birds or other animals are kept. (noun)

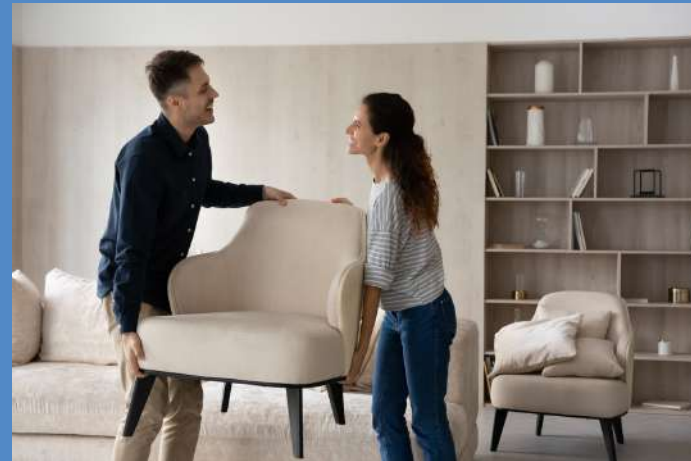


The cat did not like being kept in a **cage**.

Bird - Vocabulary

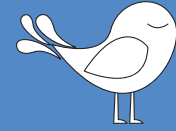


rearrange: change the position of or order of something. (verb)

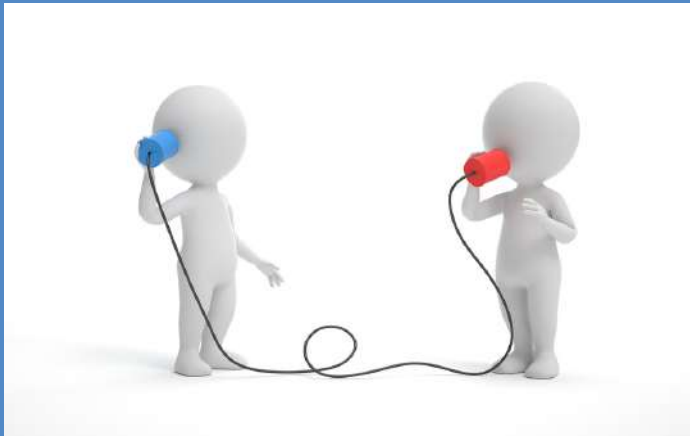


She **rearranged** the books so she could find certain ones more easily.

Bird - Vocabulary

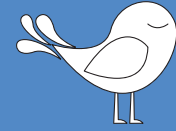


communicate: to share information with others by speaking, writing, moving your body, or using other signals. (verb)



The man is deaf, so he **communicates** by sign language.

Bird - Vocabulary



train: to teach a person or animal how to do something over a period of time. (verb)



He was able to **train** the dog to do tricks after a few weeks of practice.
