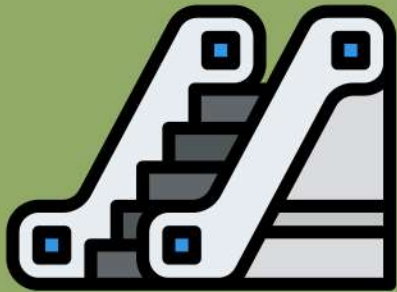

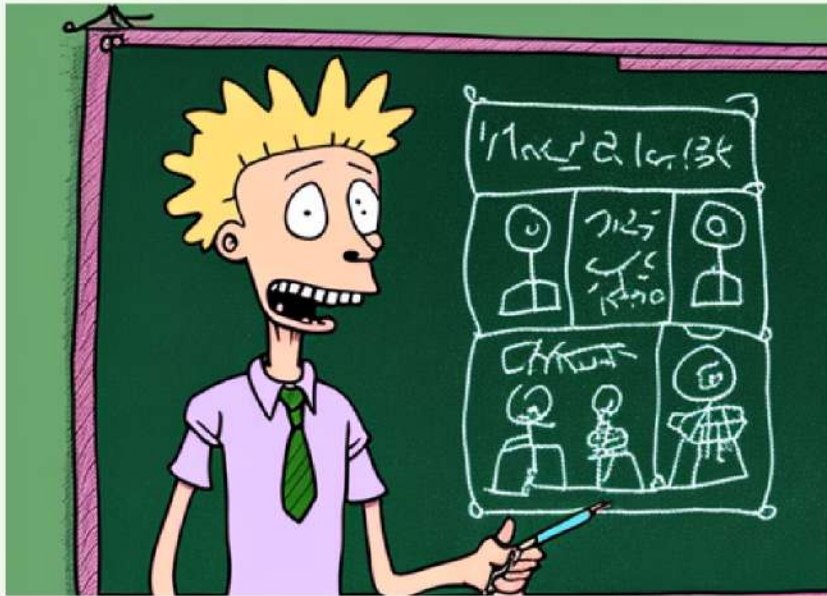


Field Trip to the Stadium

Field Trip to the Stadium



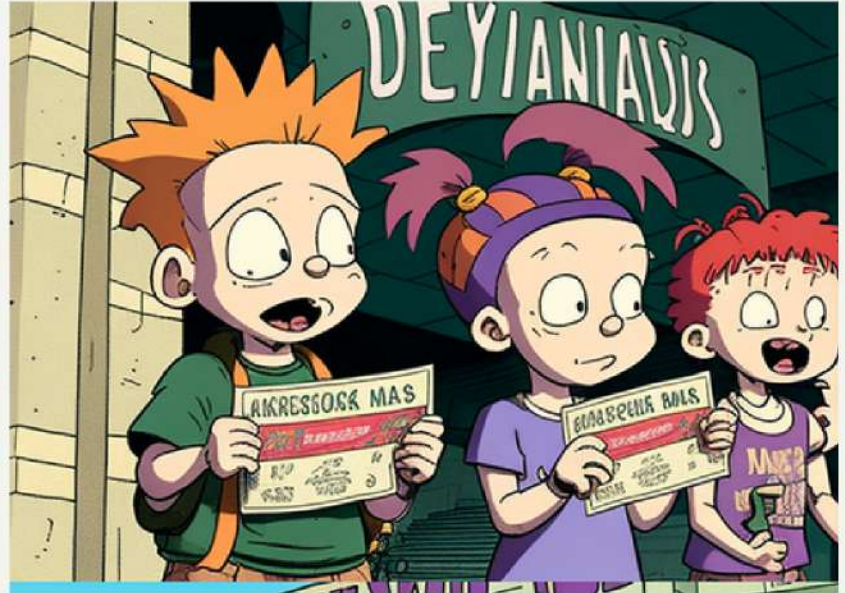
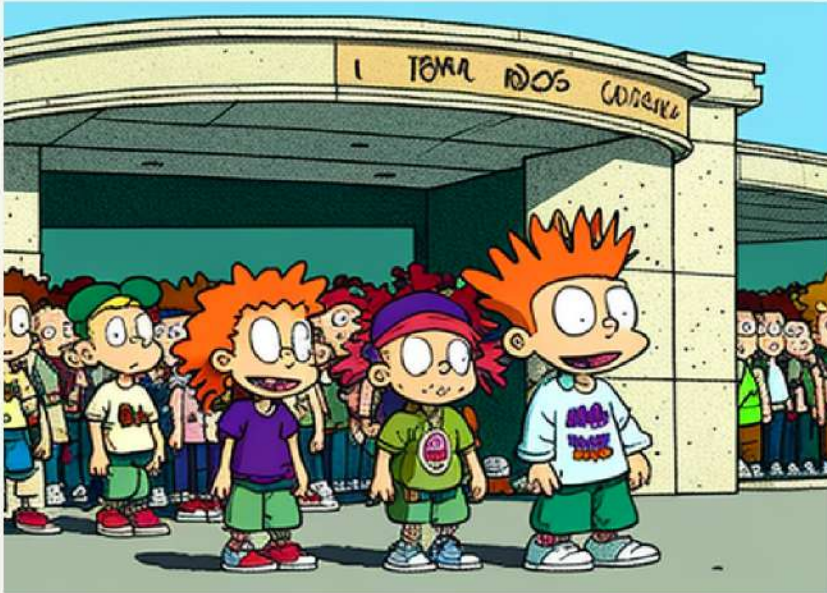
Mr. Craven and the students walked on the sidewalk and down the escalator to the subway. Some students weren't paying attention and had to run and catch up.

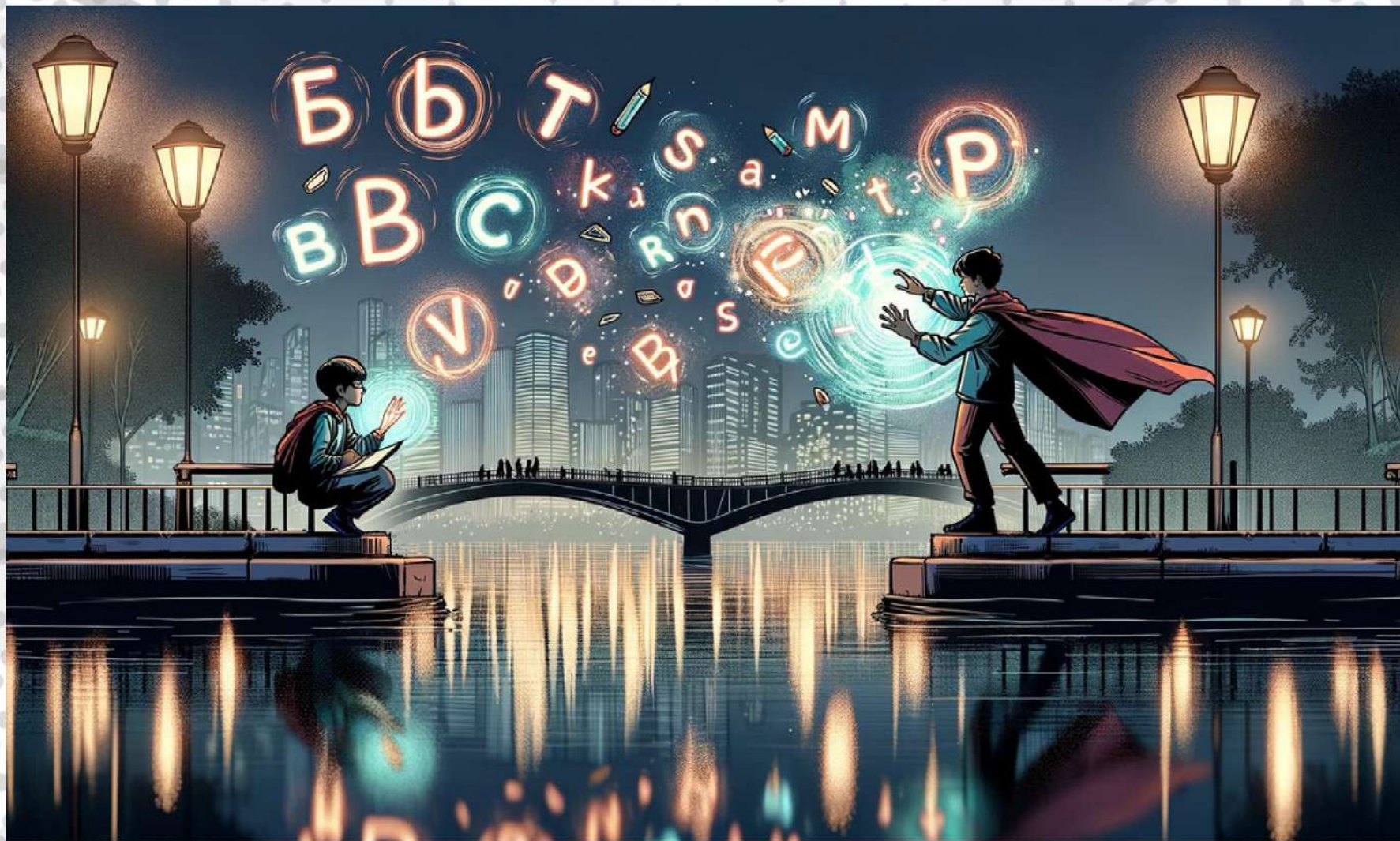


Simple Past Tense Verbs

find	found	◆	leave	left

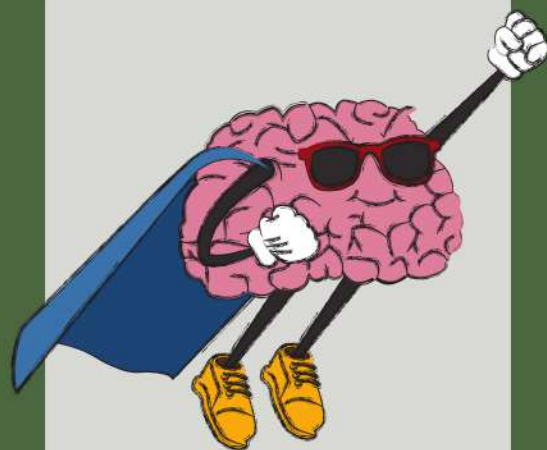
