neighborhood: a group of houses and buildings that are close together in a city or town (noun)





My neighborhood has many stores and houses.





neighbor: someone who lives near you in the same neighborhood (noun)





I like to chat with my neighbor when I see him outside.





block (city block): the smallest part of a city with streets all the way around it (noun)





I like to walk around the block for exercise.





downtown: the busiest part of a city with many buildings, shops, and people (noun)





The downtown area has many skyscrapers.

Here neighborhood has many stores and businesses. She can walk or ride her bike to get anything she needs. Her school is also only a few blocks away. She usually walks to school with her friends.





make - made

go - went

take - took

come - came

see - saw

know - knew

get - got



have - had
think - thought
give - gave
find - found
tell - told
bring - brought
feel - felt

leave - left






Phonics
