Habitats - Vocabulary



habitat: the place where plants and animals live (noun)



An alligator's **habitat** is usually in a river, swamp, or wetland.

Habitats - Vocabulary



adaptation: a change to a plant or animal that helps it live easier in its habitat (noun)



The giraffe's long neck is an **adaptation** that helps it eat leaves from trees.

Habitats - Vocabulary



send: to make something go to a different place (verb)



He used his phone to **send** a message to his friend.

store: to keep things somewhere so that you can use them in the future (verb)



They **store** many boxes full of things in the garage.

Habitats - Desert



One day in the hot, sandy desert, some animals gathered to chat. Each animal was telling why they love the desert. The desert is a very hot and dry **habitat**, but their **adaptations** let them live here.

Habitats - Desert



The rattlesnake slithered up and said, "Hey everyone, did you know that I can stay cool in the hot desert because of my scales? And I love to eat the mice and birds that live here."

Habitats - Desert



Then the desert hare hopped over and said, "I don't need much water to live, and my big ears send out heat to keep me cool. My favorite food is desert grass and cactus pads."

Next, the camel ambled in and said, "And I can store fat in my hump so I can go for days without eating and drinking. I love to munch on the prickly pear cactus and many green desert plants."

The scorpion finished listening to the other animals and said,
"And I can hide under rocks or dig holes to get out of the hot sun.
I love to dine on insects and spiders at night."
