Habitats - Vocabulary



branch: a part of a tree that grows out from the trunk (noun)

hang: connect at the top and let the bottom move free in the air (verb)

stick: to stay in place and not move away easily (verb)



The paper **sticks** to his body.
He used glue to **stick** the wood together.

sharp: having a thin edge or point that can cut something or make a hole in something (adj)



One pencil is **sharp** but the other pencil is dull.
