

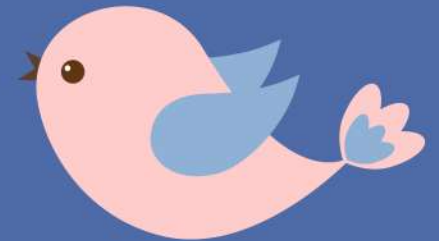

**puddle:** a small collection of water on the ground (noun)



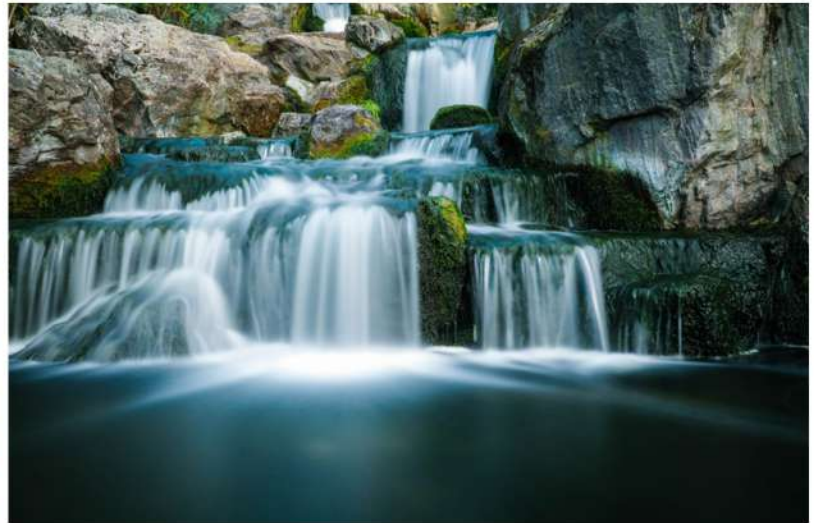
You can jump and splash in a **puddle** with your rain boots.

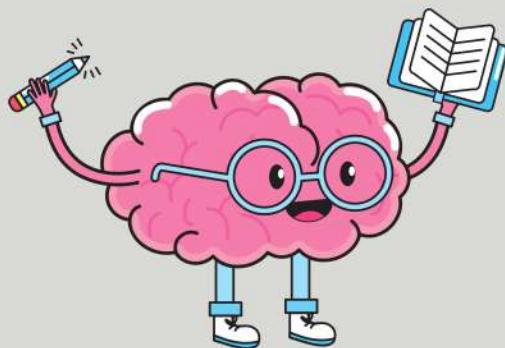
