Fashion - Vocabulary



belt: a strip of material worn around the waist to hold up or decorate clothing (noun)



I need to wear a **belt** with my pants so they don't fall down.

Fashion - Vocabulary



purse: a small bag used to carry money, keys, and other small items (noun)



The thief stole a phone out of the woman's **purse.**

on sale: when something costs less money than usual (phrase)



Everything in the store was **on sale** today.

The Perfect Belt on Sale



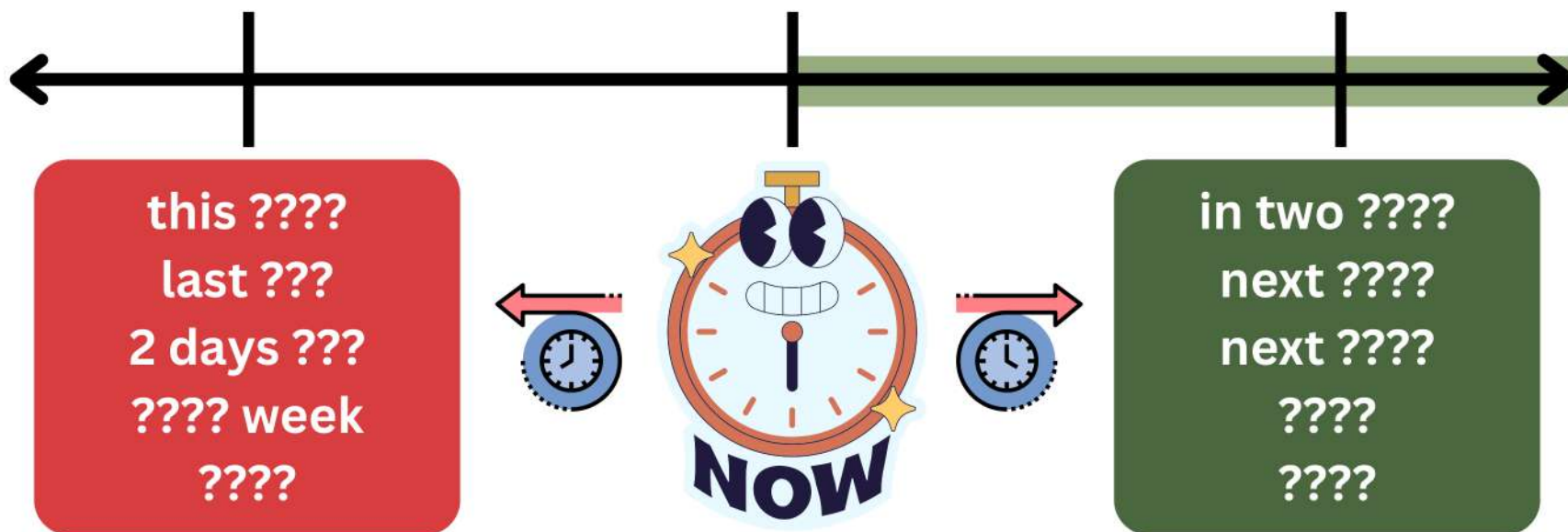
