

# Nature and Wildlife - Vocab



**endangered:** in danger of becoming extinct; having a small number of individuals remaining (adj)



Many ocean species are **endangered** due to overfishing and pollution.

# Nature and Wildlife - Vocab



**poach:** to hunt or capture wild animals illegally, usually for profit (v)



Elephants are **poached** for their ivory tusks, which are highly prized.

**Public awareness:** the extent to which the public is aware of a particular issue or problem (n)



**Public awareness** campaigns can help raise awareness about endangered species and the need for conservation efforts.

**Captive breeding:** the process of breeding animals in captivity with the goal of reintroducing them into the wild (v)

# Endangered Species and their Protection

The loss of habitat is one of the most significant threats to endangered species.



# Inversion + Adverbials

Sometimes we can place the negative or limiting adverbial in the front position to create emphasis.

In this type of sentence, the subject and the auxiliary word order are inverted. Sometimes this can be a little tricky.

I **have never** seen anything so amazing.  
**Never have** I seen anything so amazing.

I will not allow anyone to disrespect my family **under any circumstances**.

**Under no circumstances** will I allow anyone to disrespect my family.
