speaker: a device that plays sound so you can hear it (noun)

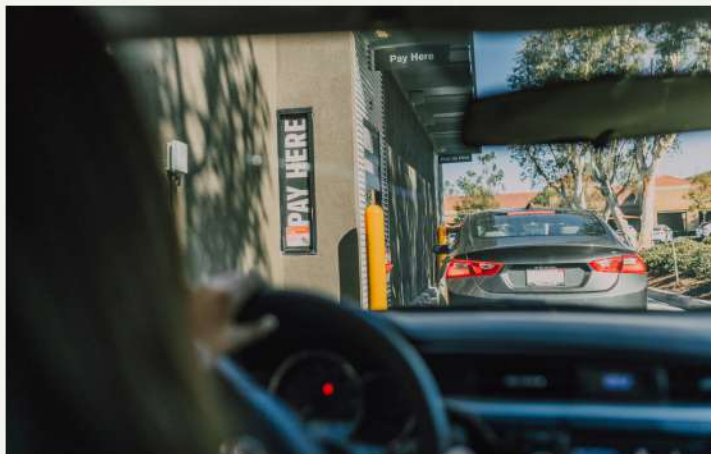


Through the Drive-Thru: Maria's Foodie Journey

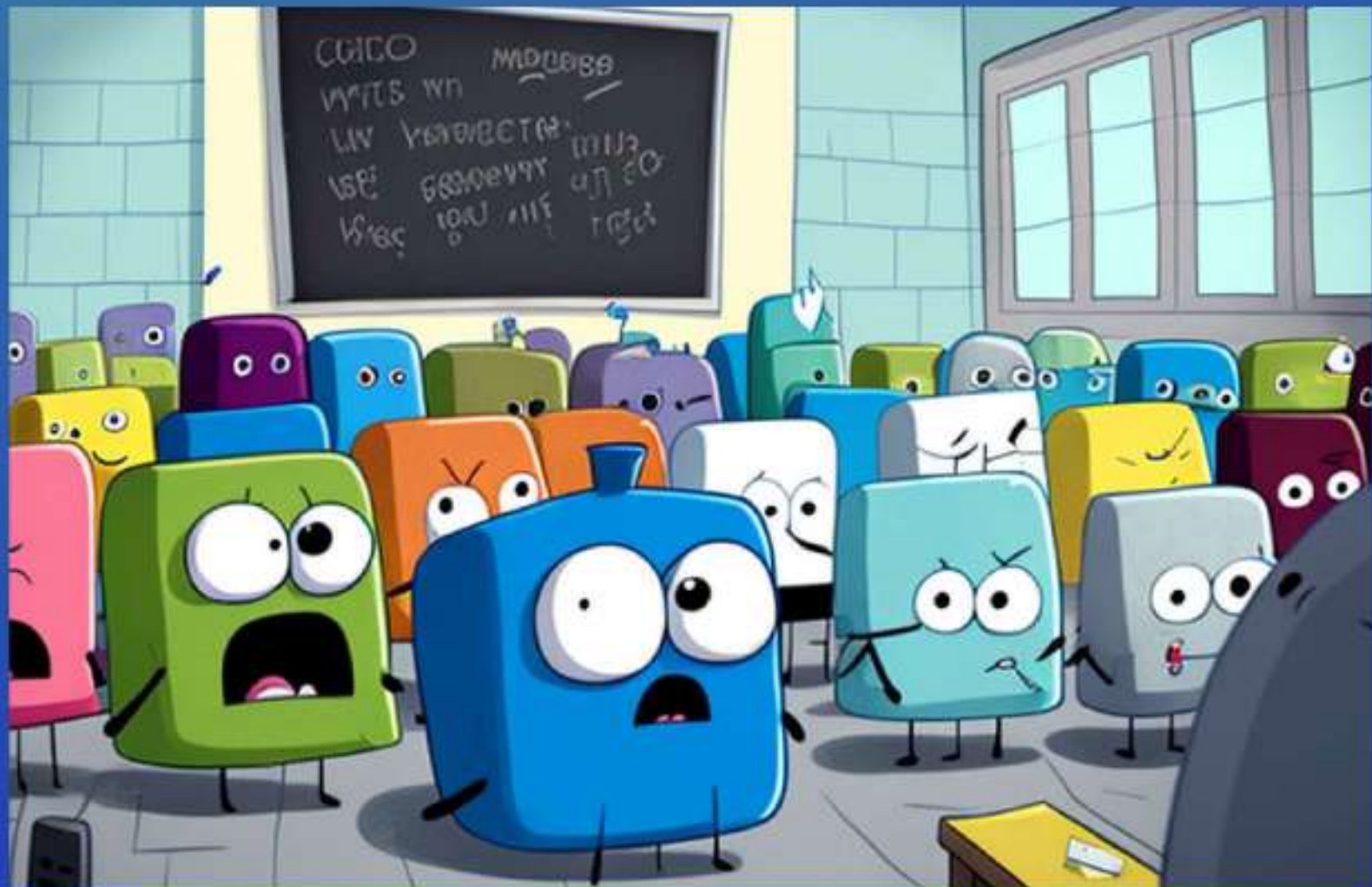


Through the Drive-Thru: Maria's Foodie Journey
