Weather - Vocabulary



thunder: a loud, booming sound that you hear during a storm (noun)



The sound of **thunder** was so loud that the boy quickly covered his ears.

shelter: a place that provides protection from bad weather or danger (noun)



The man built a **shelter** in the woods to stay dry when it rains.

lightning: a bright flash of light in the sky that comes from electricity (noun)



My little brother loves to count the seconds between **lightning** and thunder.

Weather - Vocabulary

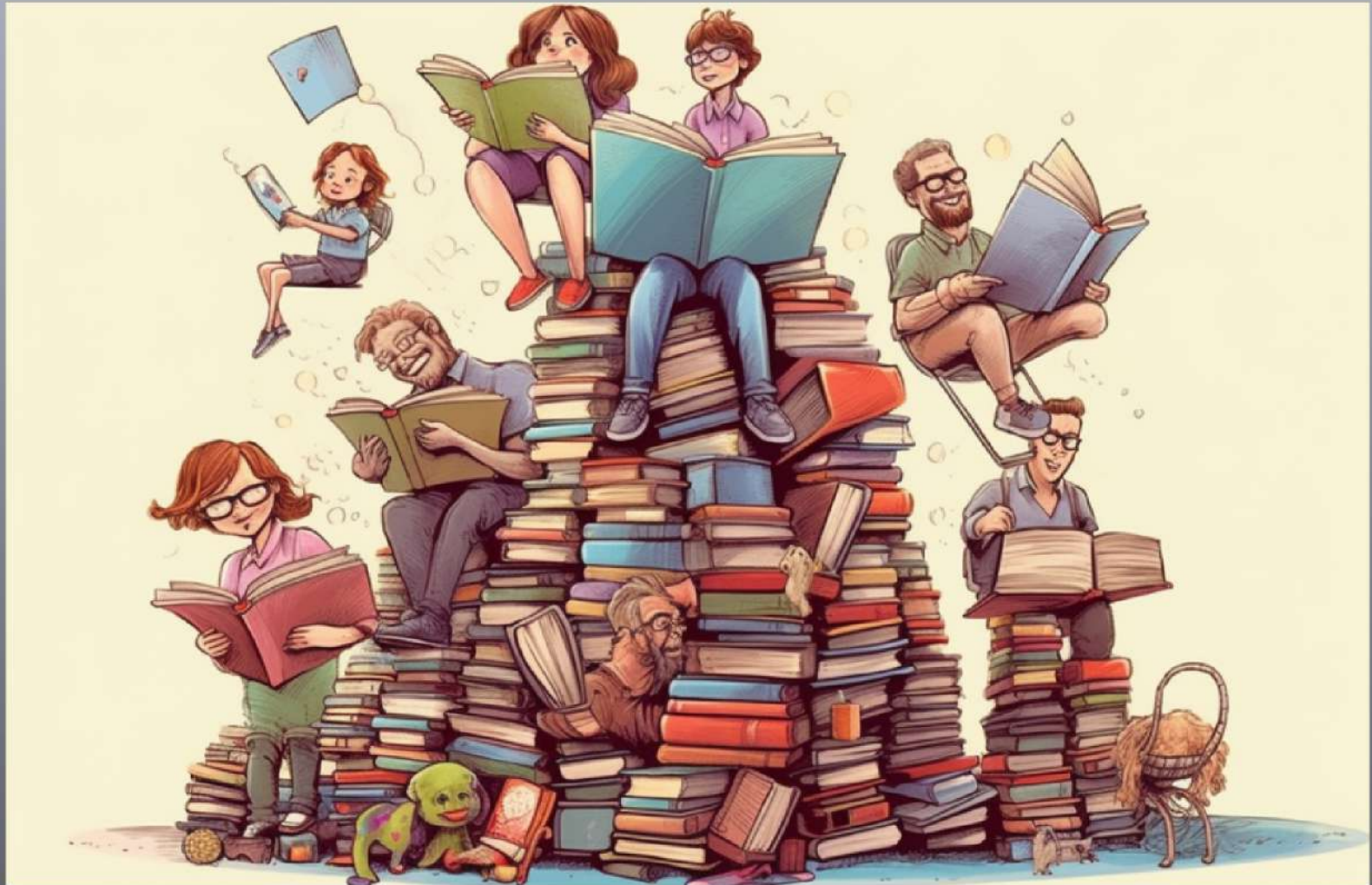


pour: to rain heavily; to make a liquid flow out of a container (verb)

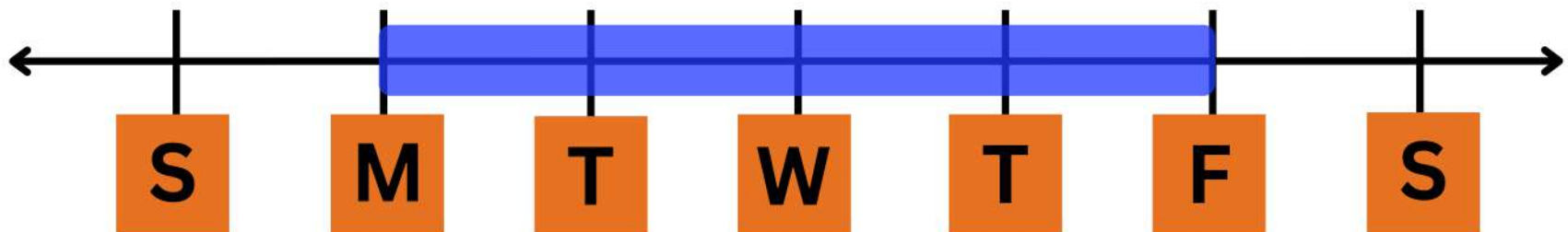


Prepositions with Time

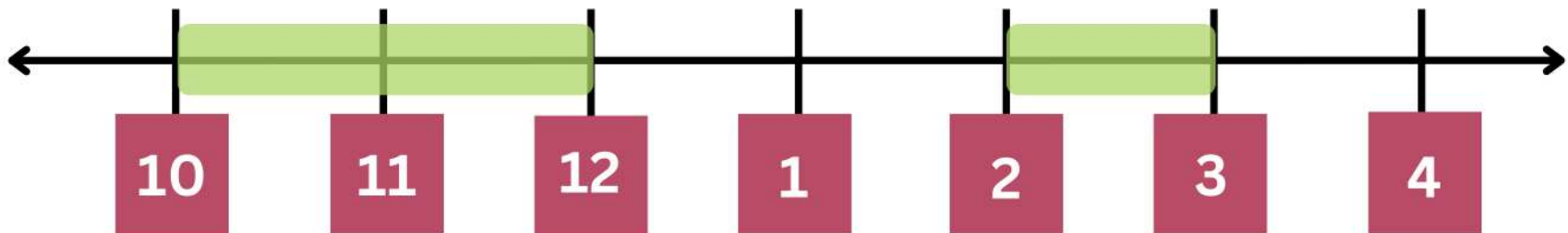
