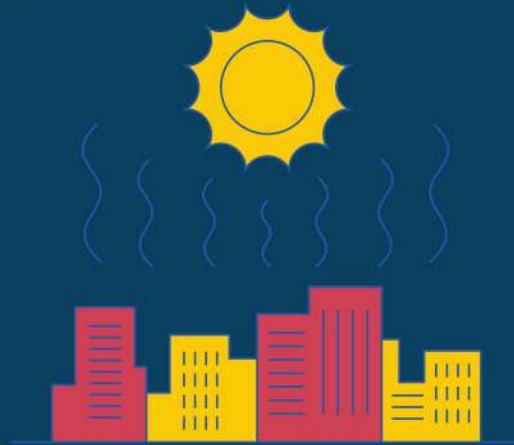
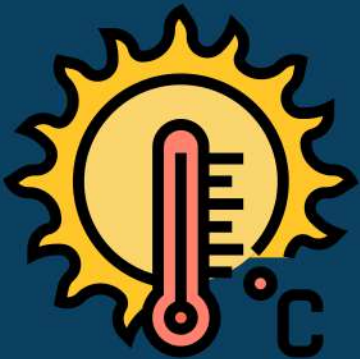

Weather - Vocabulary



heatwave: very hot and sunny weather for many days in a row (noun)



I had to drink a lot of water during the **heatwave** to stay cool.

Weather - Vocabulary



scorching: extremely hot or burning (noun)



The coffee was **scorching** hot, so I had to wait a while to drink it.

Weather - Vocabulary



humid: very wet and sticky feeling air (noun)



Plants grow well in warm, **humid** air.

Weather - Vocabulary

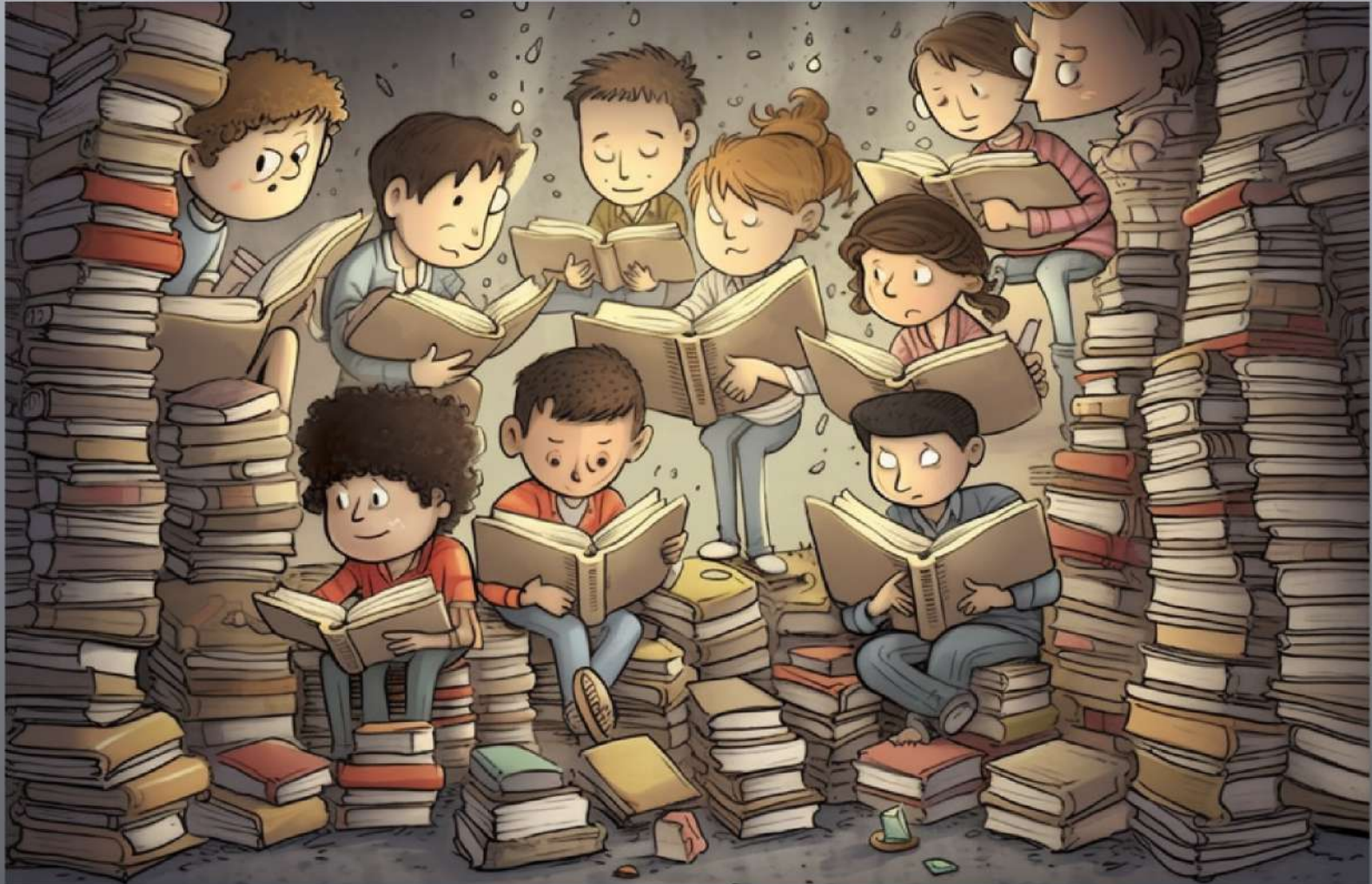


sunburn: skin that is red and hurts after being in the sun for too long (noun)



My skin turned red, and I got a **sunburn** after spending too much time in the sun.

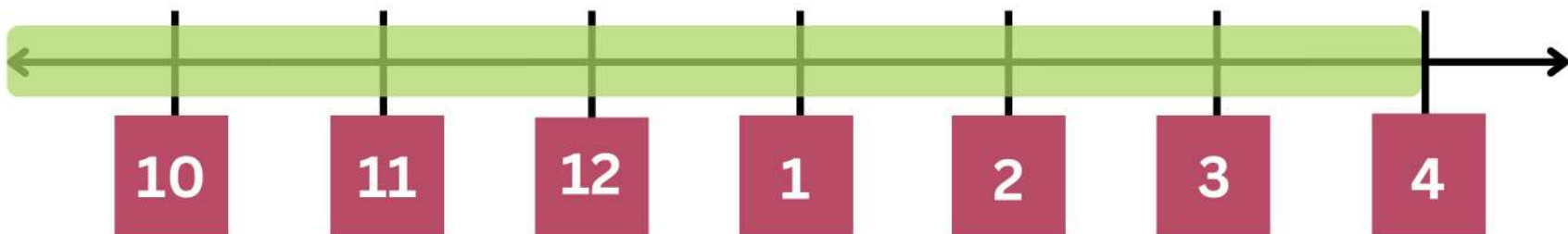

We use '**until**' with a continuous activity that keeps going and ends at a certain time.

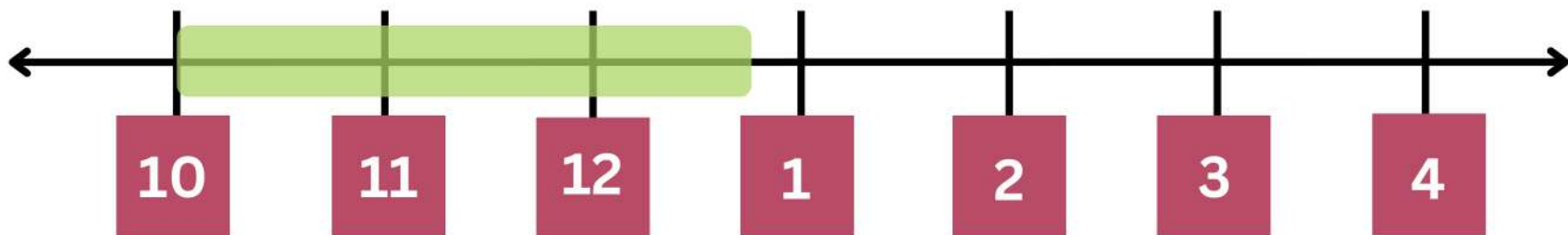
Emily is working until 4:00.



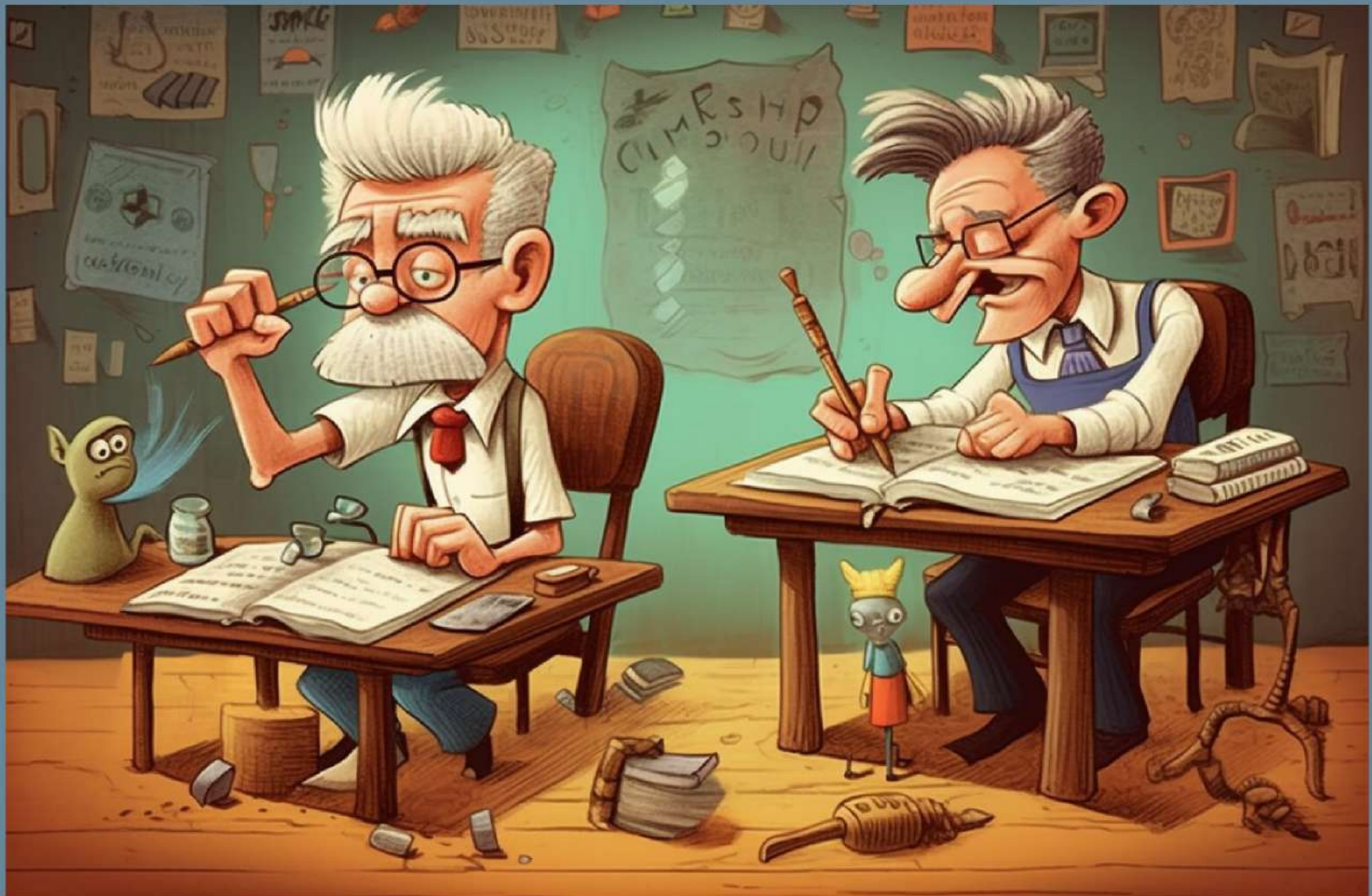
Prepositions with Time
