Travel - Vocabulary



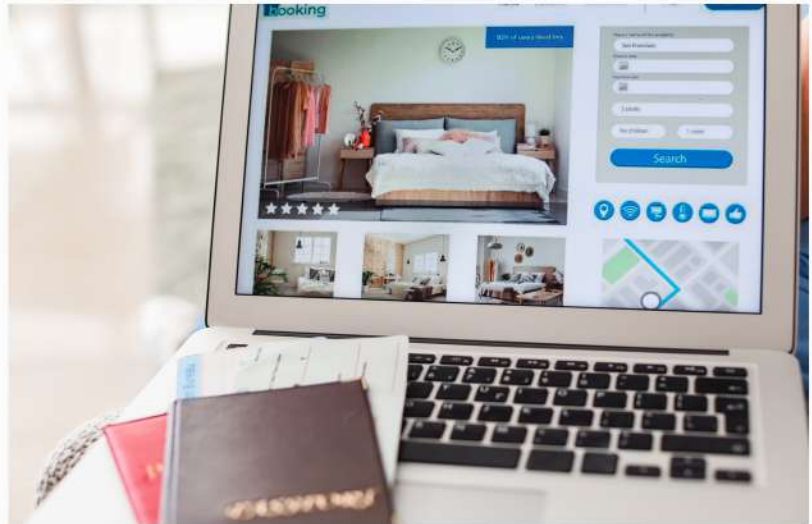
hotel: a building where you pay to have a room to sleep in (noun)

luggage: a suitcase or bag to put your clothes and things in for traveling (noun)



I brought two pieces of **luggage**; a suitcase and a backpack.

Planning a Super Fun Trip!



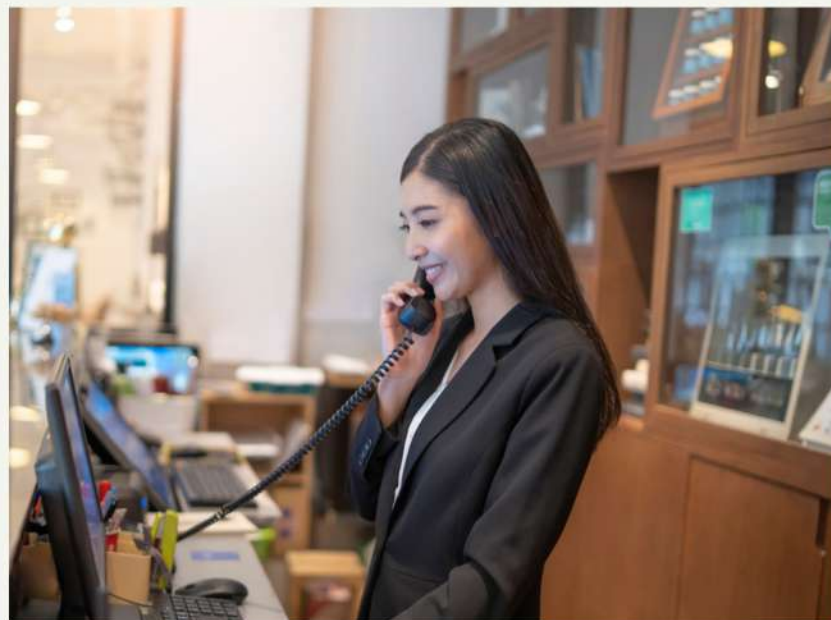
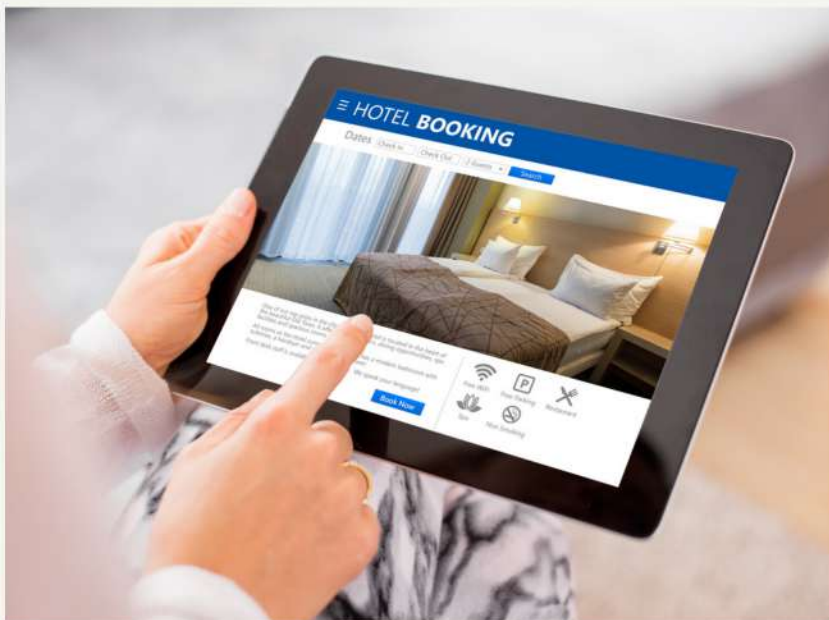
