Passive Voice With Get

We usually use the 'be' verb + past participle to form the passive voice.

He was kicked off the team.

The house was damaged in a fire.



However, with many passive sentences, we can also use 'get' instead of the 'be' verb.

He **got** kicked off the team.

The house **got** damaged in a fire.

Prefix "anti"

The prefix anti means "against" or "opposite."

Antibacterial: It works against bacteria.

Antivirus: This refers to software that protects against viruses. on your computer.

Antifreeze: A liquid that is added to the water in an engine to stop it from freezing in cold weather.
