








exam: a test to see what you have learned (noun)







The teacher said we will have an exam in math class next week.



Benny scratched his head, deep in thought, before an idea struck him.




Neither Tom nor Benny used their top-secret helmets during the exam. They both decided to use their own brain and knowledge and do the best they could.

An infinitive is to + verb. This can also act as a noun.

I like to play basketball.



We cannot use "to + playing"



I like to playing basketball.





#### Gerunds and Infinitives

Some verbs can only be followed by an infinitive.

agree, forget, plan, want, remember, promise, need

There isn't a rule. We just have to practice and remember.

I agree to meet you at 5:00.

I agree meeting you at 5:00.



I promise to clean the house.

I promise claning the house.
