My Home - Vocabulary



sheet: a large piece of cloth that is usually put on a bed under a blanket (noun)



I spread a clean **sheet** on my bed every Sunday.

My Home - Vocabulary



pillow: a soft bag usually filled with something soft, used to rest your head on in bed (noun)



I put my **pillow** over my head because my neighbor's music was too loud.

My Home - Vocabulary



mattress: a large, usually rectangular pad for supporting a lying person, usually on a bed (noun)



My old **mattress** was too soft, so I bought a firmer one.

My Home - Vocabulary



laundry: the dirty clothes and sheets that need to be, are being, or have been washed (noun)



He helped his dad do the **laundry**, and then they folded the clean clothes and put them away.

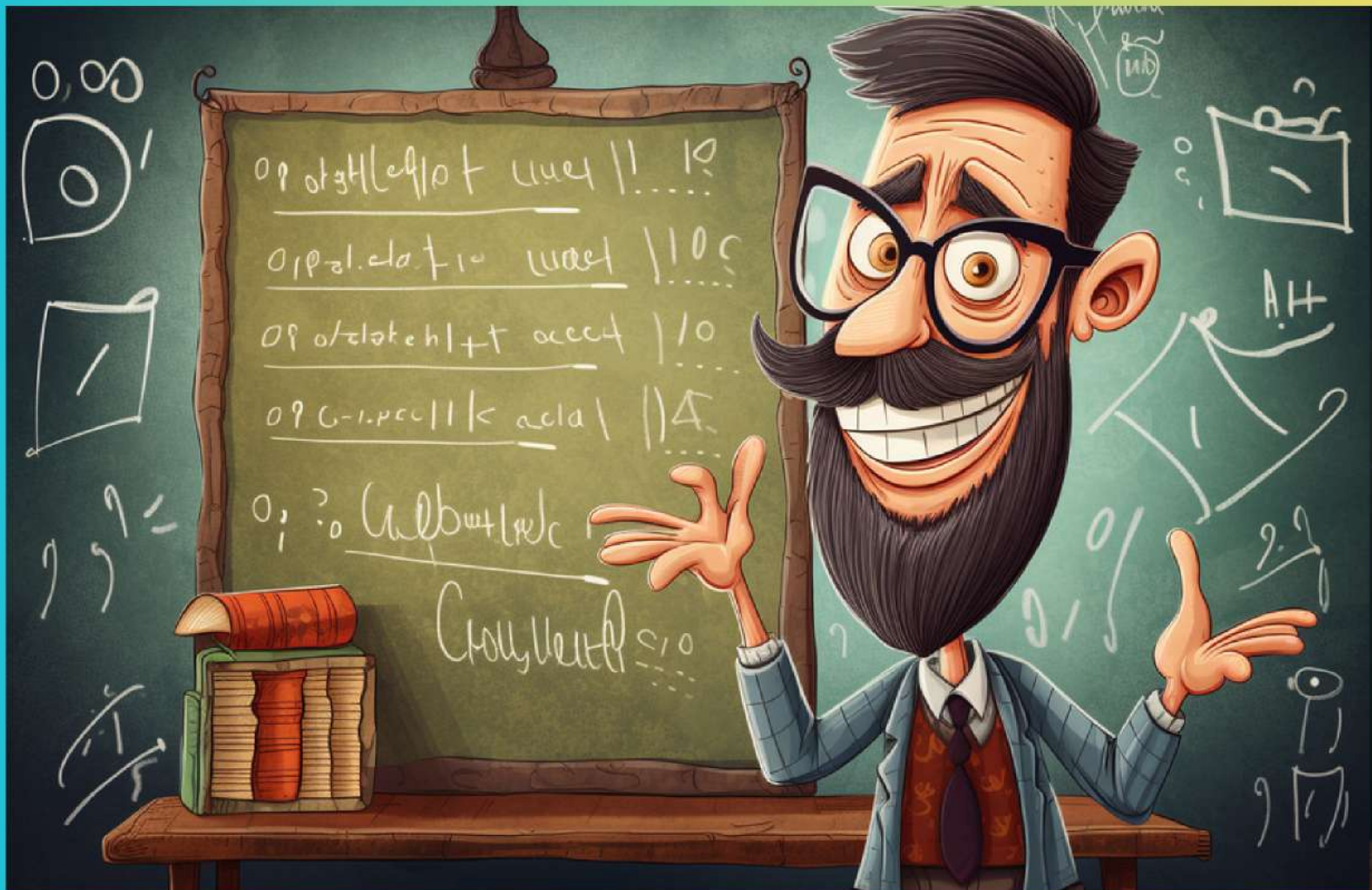


Clean Sheets, Deep Sleep: Alex's Story

very/really + adjective:

My friend Jake is **very** funny.

Daniel is **really** good at basketball.



Only '**really**' can be used to make a **verb** stronger.

really + verb:

✓ Maggie **really** likes ice cream!

✗ Maggie **very** likes ice cream!
