Vocabulary







appliance: a device or machine, especially an electrical one that is used in the house (noun)





We need to fix the washing machine; this appliance is needed for our laundry.



microwave: an electric oven that uses waves of energy to cook or heat food quickly (noun)






The microwave is an easy way to pop popcorn for movie nights.



timer: a device that makes a sound when a particular number of minutes, hours, etc. have gone (noun)





I set a **timer** for 30 minutes to remind me to check the cake in the oven.



toast: to make crisp, hot, and brown by heat (verb); bread that has been browned by heat (noun)





She burnt the **toast** because she was distracted by a phone call.


The Tale of Toast, Lasagna, and Lucas

'Very' makes an adjective stronger.

very + adjective:

This box is very heavy, but I can carry it.

'Very' can be positive or negative.



'Too" makes an adjective stronger, also.

too + adjective:

This box is too heavy. I can't lift it.

'Too' is usually negative.
