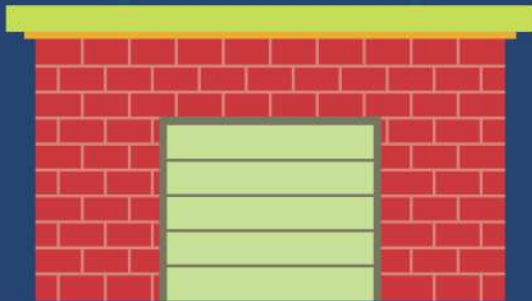

# My Home - Vocabulary



**light bulb:** a glass globe or tube that produces light when it is supplied with electricity (noun)



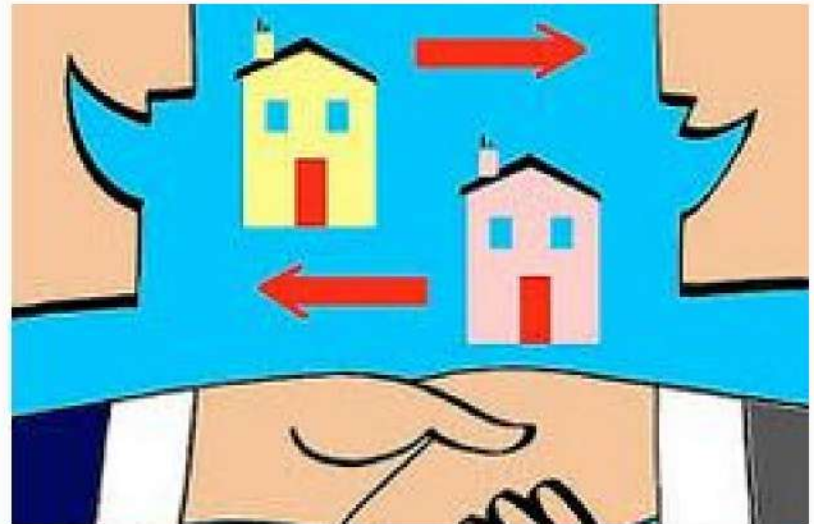
She bought a new **light bulb** with a warmer glow for her reading lamp.



# My Home - Vocabulary



**swap:** to exchange one thing for another. (noun)



I **swapped** my apple for her chocolate pudding during lunch.

# My Home - Vocabulary



**ladder:** a piece of equipment for climbing up and down a wall, the side of a building, etc. (noun)



Be careful when climbing the **ladder**; always hold on with both hands.

# My Home - Vocabulary



**storage:** the act of keeping things somewhere so that they can be used later (noun)



The basement is mainly used for **storage** and laundry.

# Very vs. Too

'Very' and 'really' make **adjectives** stronger.

**very + adjective:**

This box is **very/really** heavy, but I can carry it.

'Really' makes a **verb** stronger.

**really + verb:**

I **really** like this chocolate.

'Too' makes an **adjective** stronger, also.

**too + adjective:**

This box is **too** heavy. I can't lift it.
