

**light bulb:** a glass globe or tube that produces light when it is supplied with electricity (noun)






She bought a new **light bulb** with a warmer glow for her reading lamp.

ladder: a piece of equipment for climbing up and down a wall, the side of a building, etc. (noun)





Be careful when climbing the **ladder**; always hold on with both hands.



**storage:** the act of keeping things somewhere so that they can be used later (noun)





The basement is mainly used for **storage** and laundry.


## Let's Read!



'Very' and 'really' make adjectives stronger.

very + adjective:

This box is very/really heavy, but I can carry it.

'Really' makes a verb stronger.

really + verb:

I really like this chocolate.

'Too" makes an adjective stronger, also.

too + adjective:

This box is too heavy. I can't lift it.
