emergency: a dangerous situation, such as an accident, that needs immediate action (noun)





There was a bad accident, and people were hurt, so we called 911 for the **emergency**.



injury: harm or damage done to a person's or an animal's body (noun)






She got bit by a wild animal and has a serious **injury** on her arm.



examine: to check or study something carefully (verb)





When you are sick, the doctor will **examine** you to see what is wrong.



bandage: a long, narrow piece of cloth that is tied around an injury (noun)

The ER is like a beehive. It's always buzzing! People come here when they have an "emergency," which means they need medical help fast. They first enter the waiting room, a place with chairs where patients and families sit. They're "waiting" to see a doctor or nurse.

After waiting, a nurse or doctor will "admit" the patient. This means they take the patient from the waiting room to another special place called the exam room. In the exam room, doctors **examine** the injuries. They check how deep cuts are or if bones are really broken.
