pill: a small, usually round and hard medicine (noun)






The doctor gave me some pills to take because I am sick with a cold.



**prescription:** a note from the doctor for special medicine. (noun)






I gave my **prescription** to the pharmacist to buy some medicine.




#### Enough vs. Plenty
