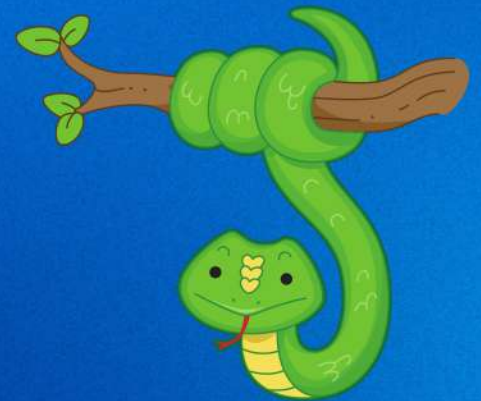
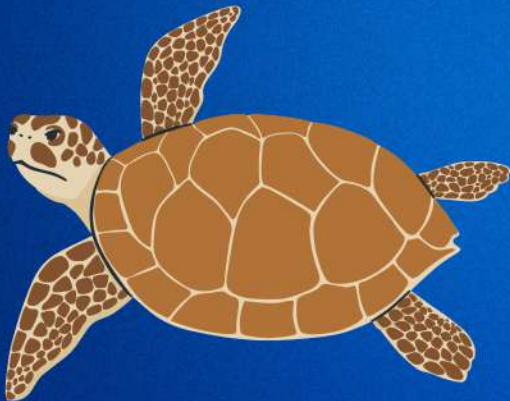

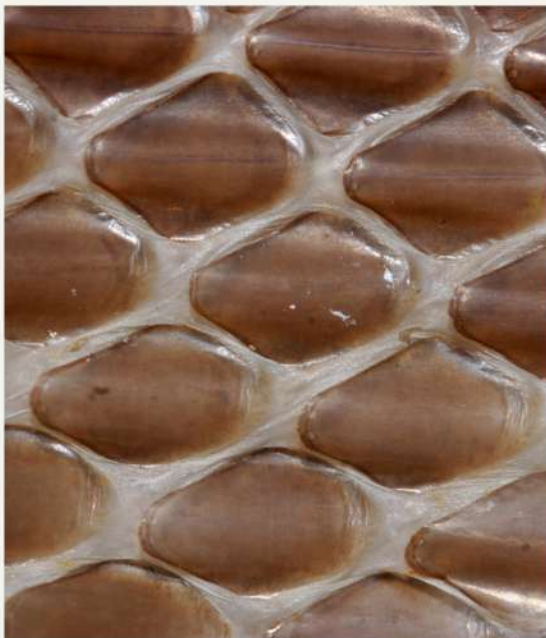


Reptile Riddles Revealed!

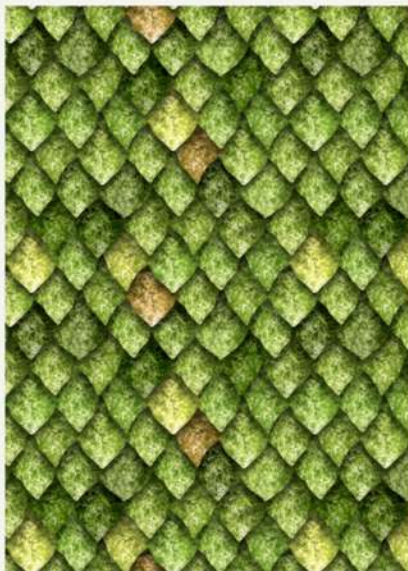
