# Transport - Vocabulary



**track (train):** the metal rails on which a train runs  
(noun)



Workers were fixing the train **tracks** near the station.

# Transport - Vocabulary



**announce:** to tell people information about something, often over a loud speaker (noun)



Everyone listened carefully to the pilot **announce** some information about the flight.

# Transport - Vocabulary



**schedule:** a plan that lists the times certain things will happen (noun)



Her **schedule** showed a meeting at 6:00.

# Transport - Vocabulary



**brake:** a device used to slow down or stop a vehicle (noun); to make a vehicle slow down or stop (verb)



He squeezed the **brake** with his hand to stop the bike.

Her grandparents were waiting at the platform, arms open wide. The city's hustle fell away as Lena ran into their warm hugs.

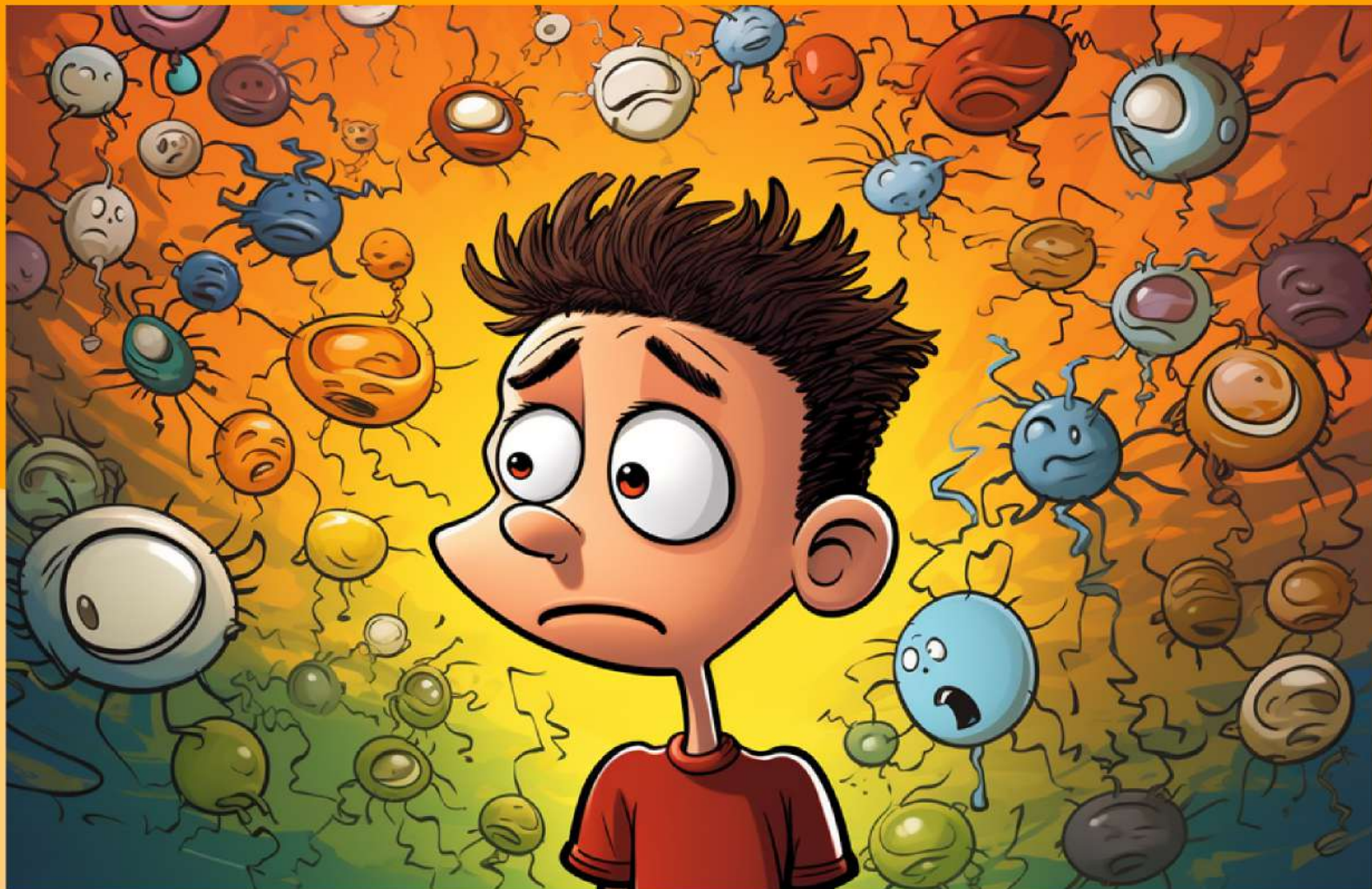
# Zooming to Changsha
