(adjective)



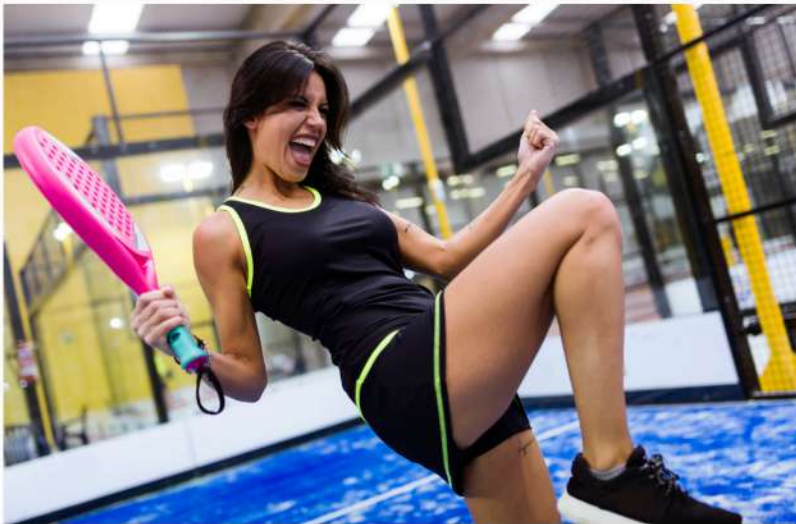
She got all the answers right. It was a **perfect** score.

She went to the store to **return** the shirt she bought because it was too big.



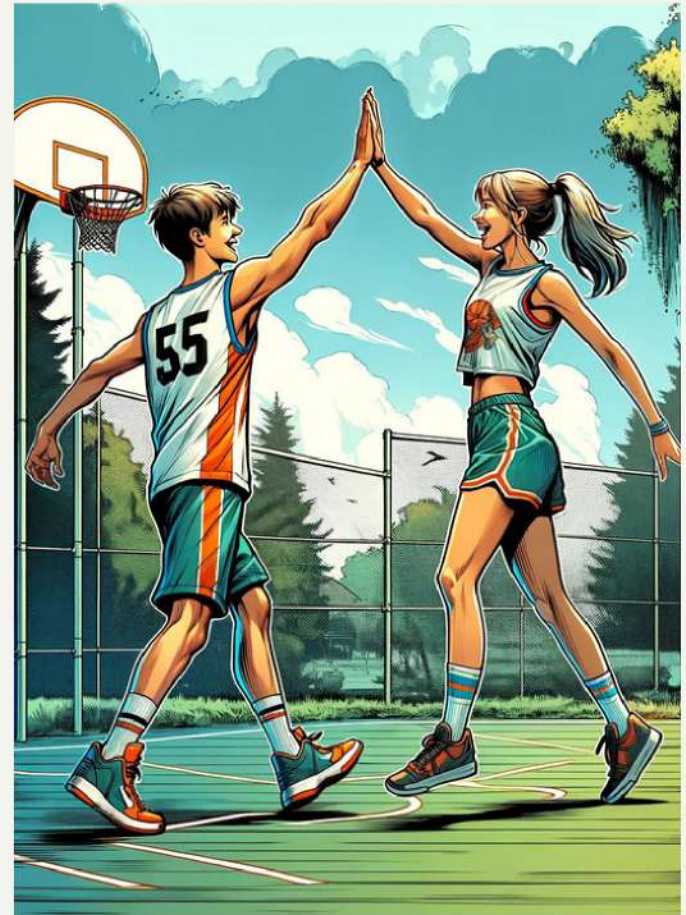

# Hanging Out at Riverside Park

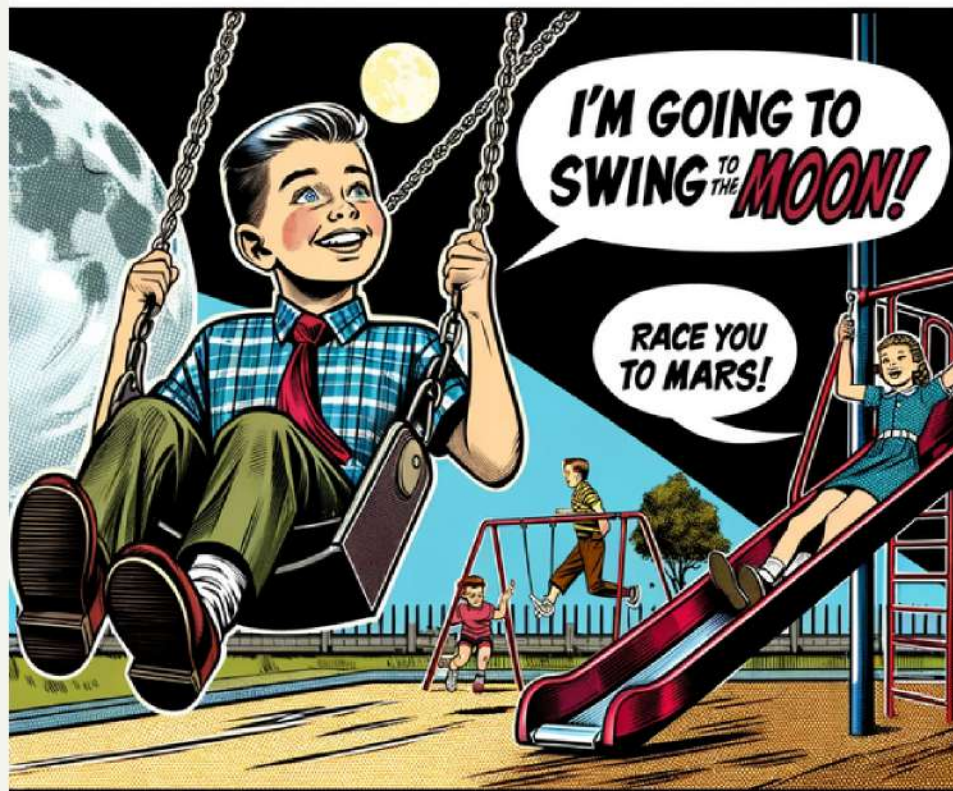

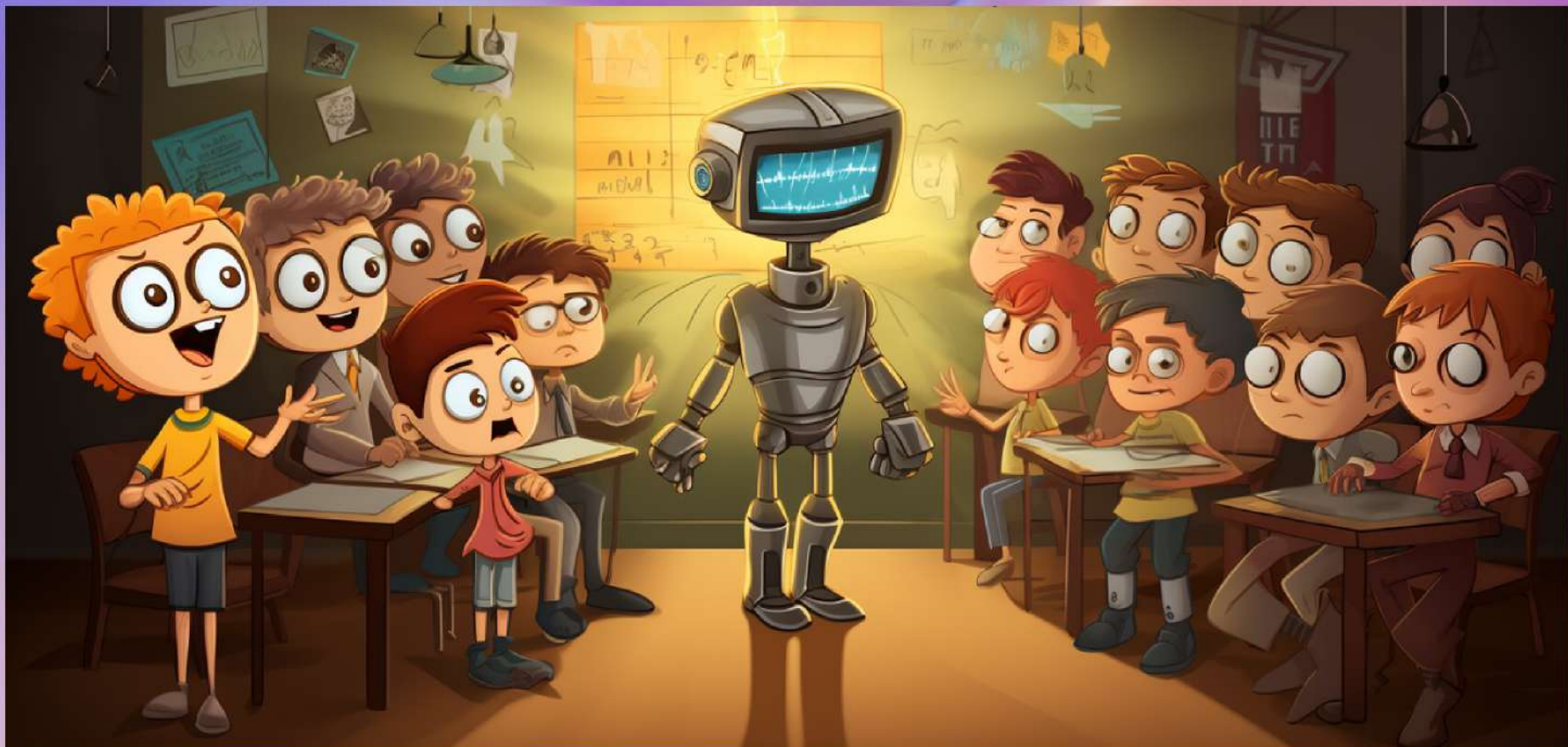
# Hanging Out at Riverside Park

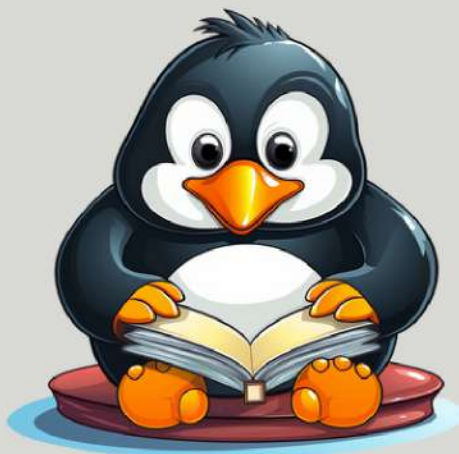
