

jaw: the lower part of your face that moves when you open your mouth (noun)





She can open her jaw really wide to sing loudly.



tear off: to remove something quickly and forcefully (phrasal verb)





The kids tear off the wrapping paper on Christmas morning.



agile: able to move quickly and easily in all directions (adjective)





Cats are very agile and can jump high.



chomp: to chew or bite on something loudly or with a lot of force (verb)





You can hear the hippo **chomp** on its food.


Fun Fact:

Spinosaurus's sail might have been used to show off to other dinosaurs.


Pack Hunting Raptors?

Allosaurus, the Fearless Hunter!



Sharks live in the ocean. (fact)

Present Continuous: Used for actions happening now.

I am busy cleaning my house at the moment.
I am taking swimming lessons this month.

Past Simple: Used for actions that happened in the past.

I studied for 2 hours last night.
