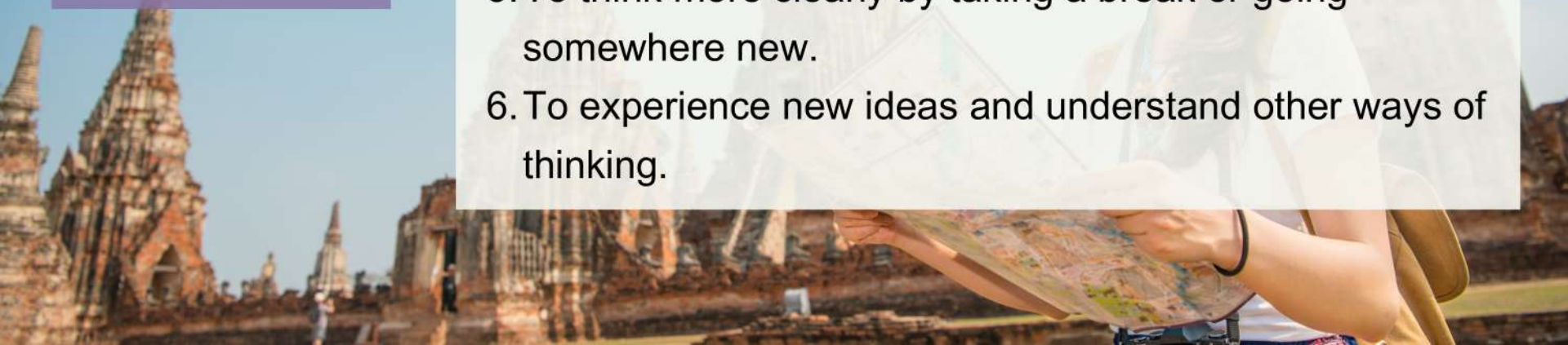
1. What kind of trip would you find the most exciting—city, nature, or amusement park?
