Sports - Vocabulary



organ: a part of a person's body that performs a special job (noun)



The human body has 78 different **organs** such as the heart and lungs. The skin is the largest **organ**.

Sports - Vocabulary



lungs: a pair of organs in the chest that supply the body with oxygen (noun)



We breathe air in through our nose and down into our **lungs**.

Sports - Vocabulary



heart: the organ in your chest that sends the blood around your body (noun)





He exercises a lot, so he has a really strong **heart**.


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


