Movies - Vocabulary





UDP

genre: a French word for things like books, music, or movies that share the same style (noun)



My favorite genre of movies is action. I love to see a lot of exciting things!

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cast: the characters or the people acting in a movie, play, or show (noun) nalis



This movie has a **cast** with a lot of great actors.

script: the written words of a movie, play, or show (noun)



The actors had to memorize the script before they made the movie.

director: a person who tells the actors how to play their part in the movie (noun)



The director told the actor she needed to act angrier for this scene.
