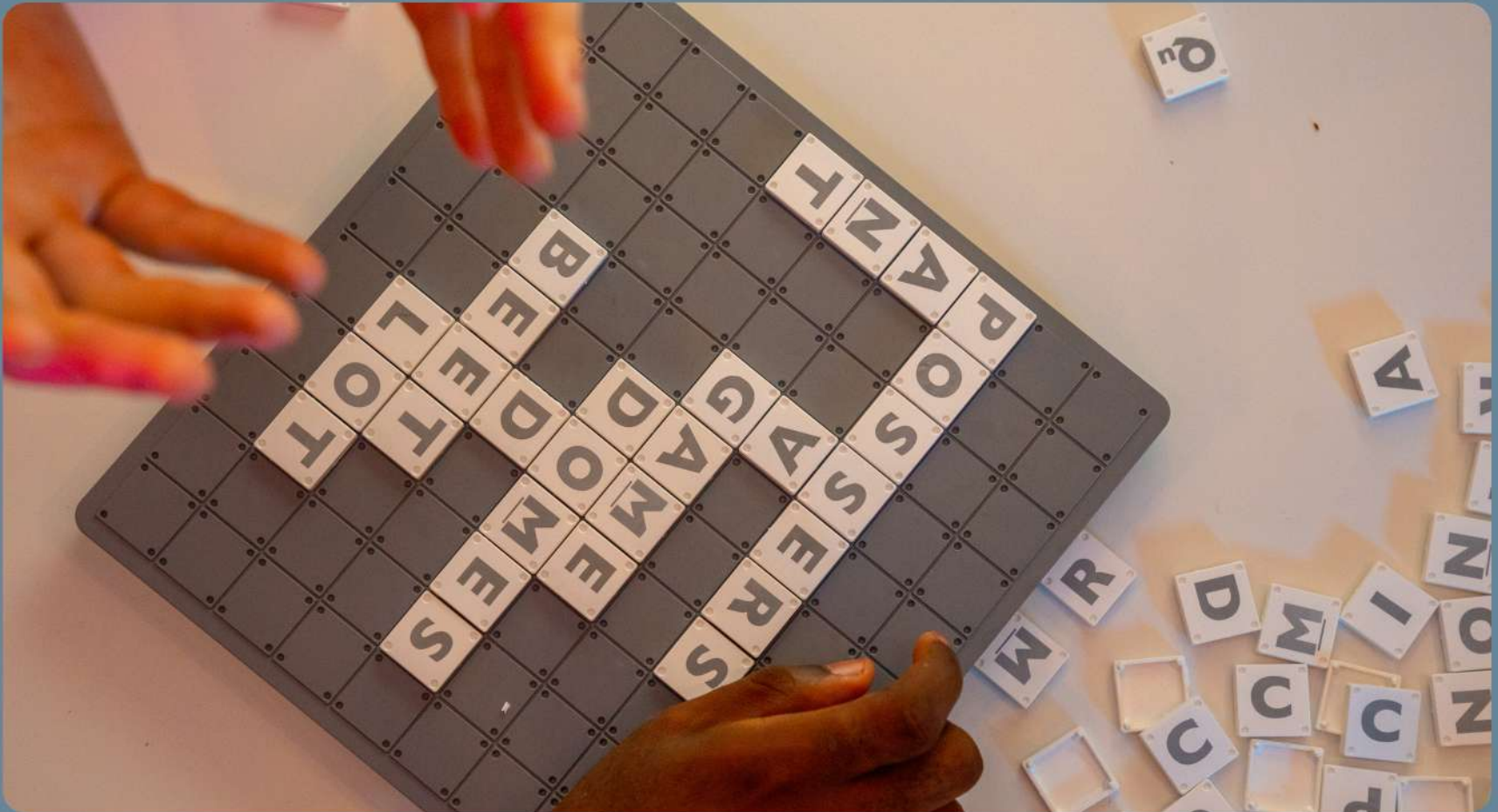

Vocabulary



Police - Vocabulary



criminal: a person who breaks the law. (noun)



The police are looking for the **criminal** who stole money from the bank.

Police - Vocabulary



arrest: to take someone to jail because they are thought to have broken the law. (verb)



The police **arrest** criminals and put them in jail.

Police - Vocabulary



jail: a place where criminals are kept as punishment. (noun)



If you do bad things you might have to go to **jail**.

Police - Vocabulary



dangerous: able or likely to hurt or harm you.
(adjective)



Swimming with sharks is very **dangerous**.

many - a lot of

We use **many/a lot of** when we don't know the exact amount of something.

They have many apples.



She has a lot of money.



We can only use **many** with countable nouns.
We can use **a lot of** with everything.
