Dairy - Vocabulary



Dairy: made from milk. (adj)



Cheese, yogurt, and ice cream are all **dairy** foods.

Dairy - Vocabulary



machine: something made by people to make work easier.
(noun)



The farmer uses a **machine** to get milk from the cows.

Dairy - Vocabulary



processing plant: a place where food is made healthy for us to eat. (noun)



The milk is sent to a **processing plant** before it is sent to the stores.

Dairy - Vocabulary



container: a hollow object such as a box or a bottle, which can be used for holding something. (noun)



He puts his food in a plastic **container** and takes it to work for lunch.

-ful = full of pain+**ful** = painful
