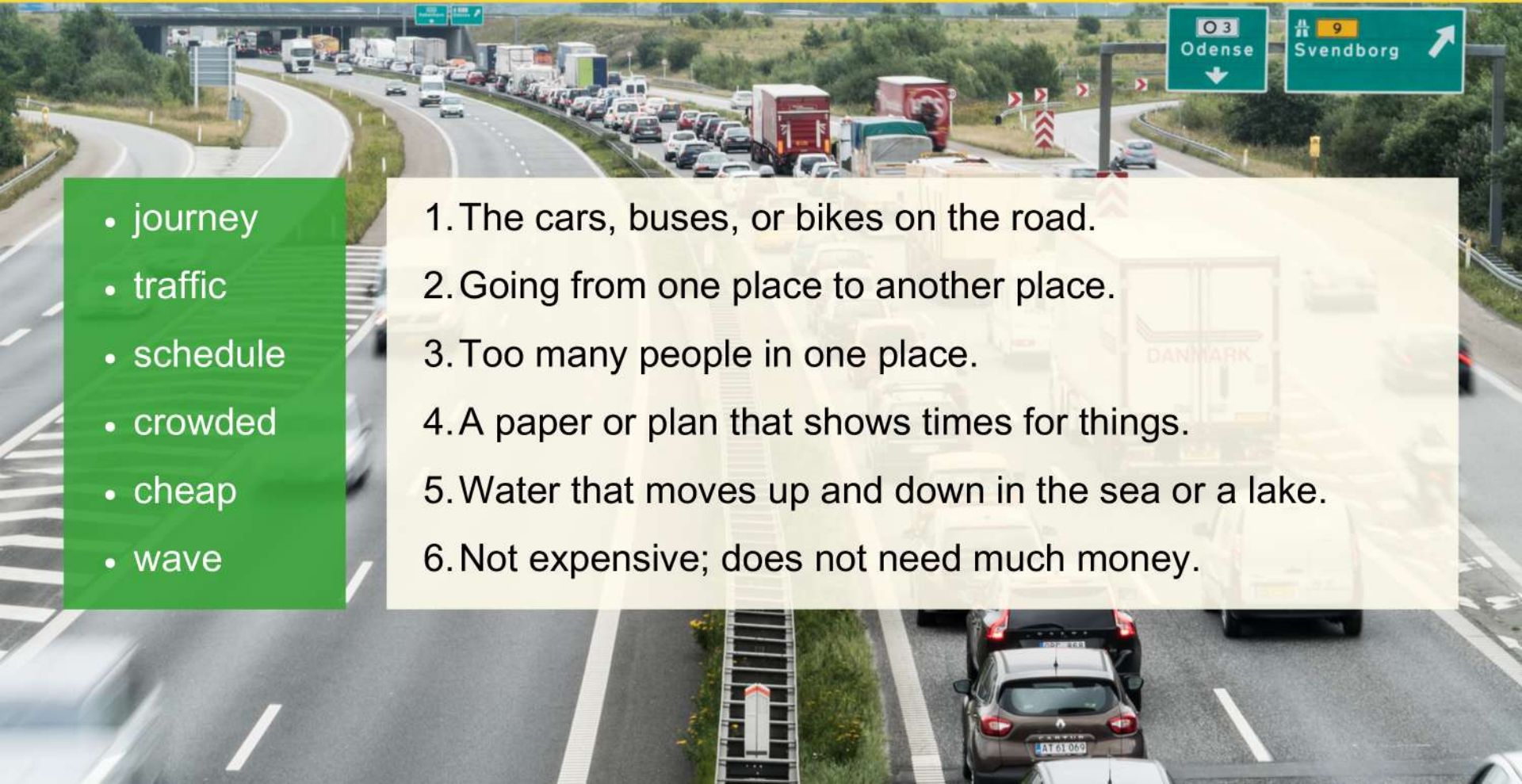

Emma: Maybe. I like to sit by the window.

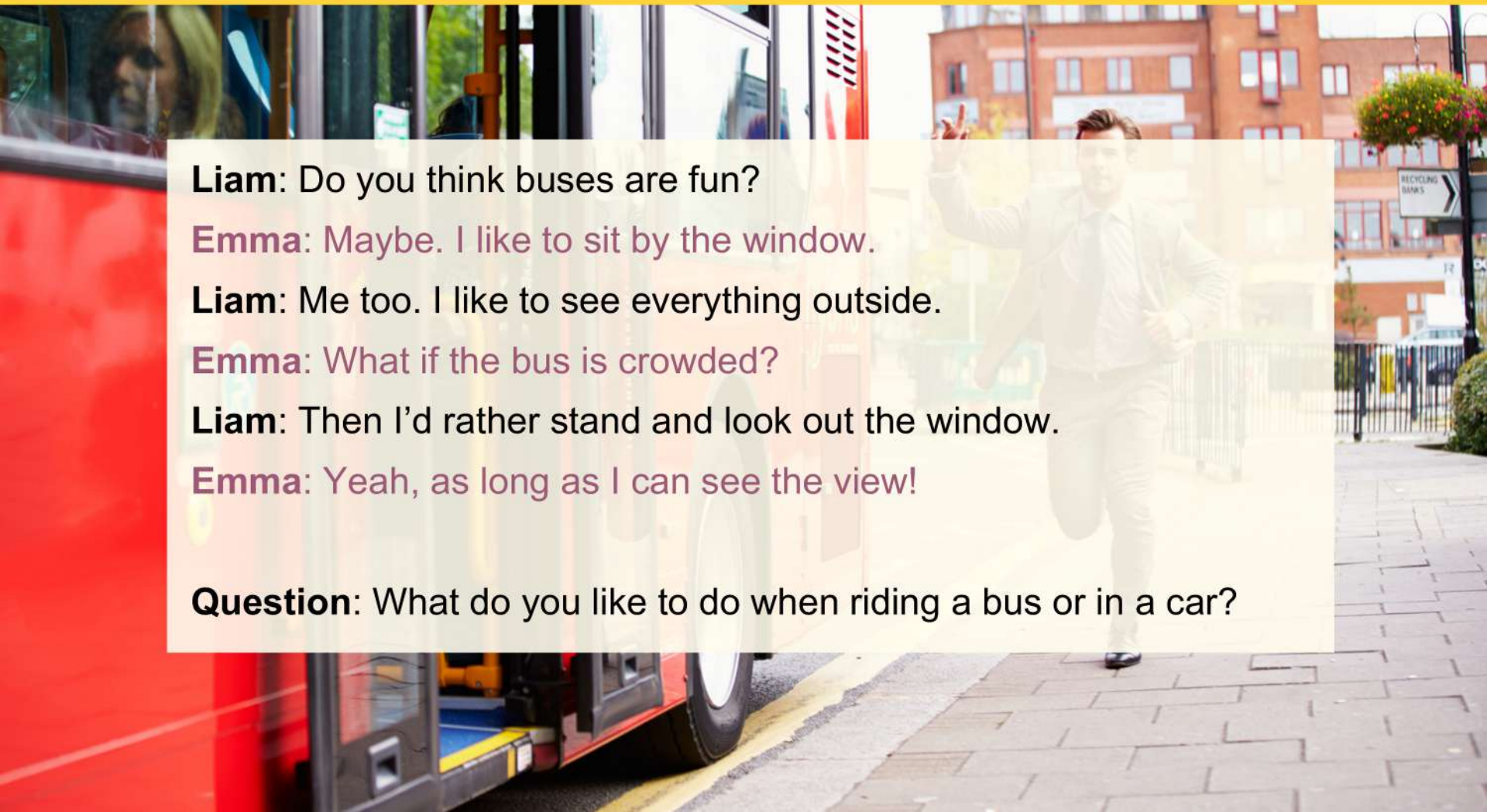
Liam: Me too. I like to see everything outside.
