

The movie's special effects were so realistic that it felt like we were in the future.





#### Passive Voice With Get

We usually use the 'be' verb + past participle to form the passive voice.

He was kicked off the team.

The house was damaged in a fire.



However, with many passive sentences, we can also use 'get' instead of the 'be' verb.


He got kicked off the team.

The house **got** damaged in a fire.

Maya: True, but he made his mural deteriorate, remember? Even legends mess up.


Liam: Fair point. So I'm basically a genius in progress?

### Prefix "anti"

The prefix anti means "against" or "opposite."

Antibacterial: It works against bacteria.

Antivirus: This refers to software that protects your computer against viruses.

**Antifreeze**: A liquid that is added to the water in an engine to stop it from freezing in cold weather.

**Antisocial**: Opposed to the principles of social order, or behaving in a way that avoids social interaction.
