## Aesthetic

- **Definition:** Related to beauty or visual appeal; how something looks and feels artistically.
- **Example Sentence:** The painting has a clean, minimalist aesthetic that feels calm and balanced.
- **Synonyms:** visual appeal, artistic style, beauty
- **Question:** What kind of aesthetic do you prefer in art—simple or detailed? Why?

## Evocative

- **Definition:** Causing strong feelings, memories, or mental images.
- **Example Sentence:** The artwork is highly evocative and reminds viewers of childhood memories.
- **Synonyms:** emotional, moving, thought-provoking
- **Question:** Can you think of a piece of art, music, or film that you find evocative?

# Vocabulary



## Composition

- **Definition:** The way different elements in a piece of art are arranged or organized.
- **Example Sentence:** The composition of the painting guides the viewer's eyes toward the main subject.
- **Synonyms:** layout, arrangement, structure
- **Question:** Do you notice the composition of a painting when you look at art, or do you focus more on color and subject?

# Vocabulary

## Abstract

- **Definition:** A style of art that does not try to show realistic images, but instead uses shapes, colors, or forms to express ideas.
- **Example Sentence:** Although the artwork is abstract, it clearly expresses emotion and movement.
- **Synonyms:** non-representational, conceptual, symbolic
- **Question:** Do you enjoy abstract art, or do you prefer realistic paintings? Why?
