The girl **packed** her bag for school.

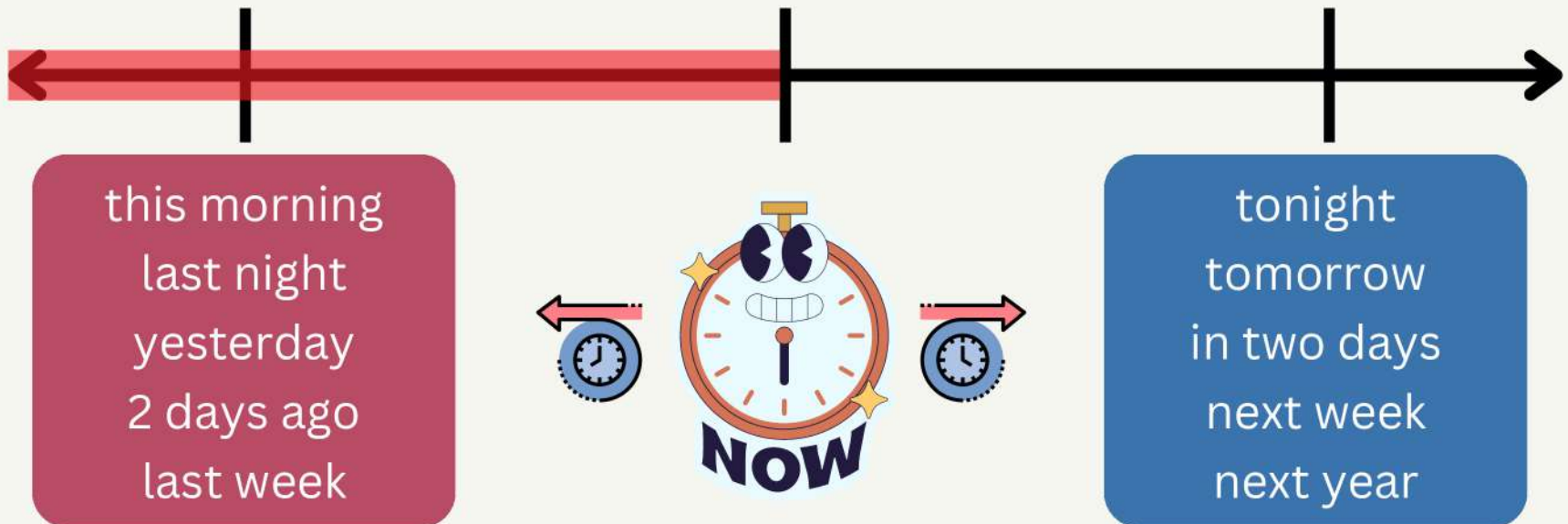


Simple Past Tense Verbs

closed

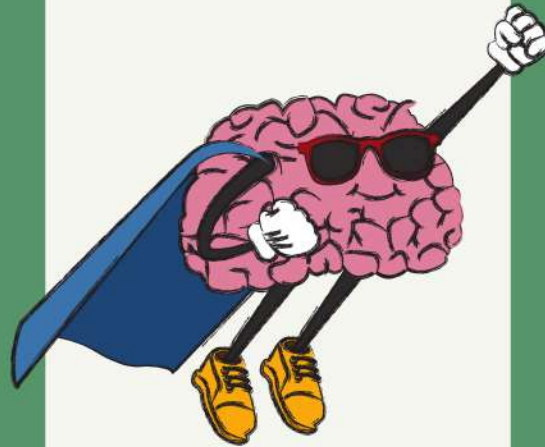
UNLOCKING WORDS
