



Outdoors - Vocabulary



rafting: traveling down a river on a raft (noun)



It was exciting to go **rafting** down the river.

Outdoors - Vocabulary



grab: to quickly take and hold with your hand (verb)



The boy reached up to **grab** the donut.

Outdoors - Vocabulary



life jacket: a jacket you wear to help you float in water
(noun)



The boy put on his **life jacket** to stay safe.

balance: to stay up and not fall to one side (verb)



The man **balanced** his body and walked across the rope.

2. What would you do if you were in the raft?





Simple Past Tense Verbs

We use **past simple** for things that have already happened.

past (before now)



this morning
last night
yesterday
2 days ago
last week

future (after now)



tonight
tomorrow
in two days
next week
next year



Simple Past Tense Verbs

Verbs that end with the sound of /p/ /k/ /f/ /s/ /sh/ /ch/,
then the **-ed** ending sounds like a **/t/**

helped
looked
laughed
kissed
washed
watched



danced



cooked

Simple Past Tense Verbs

-ed with /t/ sound



walked



dropped



joked

UNLOCKING WORDS



Word Endings: CH / TCH

The letters "**ch**" and "**tch**" make the same sound at the end of a word.

ranch


