

Outdoors - Vocabulary



mountain: land that is much higher than the land around it (noun)



Snow covered the top of the **mountain**.

Outdoors - Vocabulary



trail: a path through the countryside, mountain, or forest area (noun)



They hiked up the **trail** to the top of the mountain.

Outdoors - Vocabulary



river: a long stream of water flowing toward the ocean or other body of water (noun)



The **river** flows very fast in the mountains.

Outdoors - Vocabulary



hike: to walk through the countryside, mountain, or forest area (verb)



The boys **hike** in the mountains often.




Simple Past Tense Verbs


We use **past simple** for things that have already happened.

past (before now)

future (after now)



this morning
last night
yesterday
2 days ago
last week



tonight
tomorrow
in two days
next week
next year


Simple Past Tense Verbs

Verb ends in a vowel sound or a voiced consonant (l, n, r, b, g, m, z, v), then the **-ed** ending sounds like a **/d/**

called**ed**
cleaned**ed**
offered**ed**
enjoyed**ed**
used**ed**
grabbed**ed**



loved**ed**



followed**ed**

Simple Past Tense Verbs

-ed with **/d/** sound



entered



carried



played

UNLOCKING WORDS



Word Endings: CH / TCH

The letters **"ch"** and **"tch"** make the same sound at the end of a word.


