Some **past tense verbs** do not follow the rules. You cannot add -ed to these verbs. They change to new words. These are called **irregular** past tense verbs.

have	had	teal diamond	tell	told
think	thought	teal diamond	bring	brought
give	gave	orange diamond	feel	felt
find	found	orange diamond	leave	left


