VOCABULARY

Hospitals - Vocabulary

emergency: a dangerous situation, such as an accident, that needs immediate action (noun)



There was a bad accident, and people were hurt, so we called 911 for the **emergency**.

Hospitals - Vocabulary

injury: harm or damage done to a person's or an animal's body (noun)



She got bitten by a wild animal and has a serious **injury** on her arm.

Hospitals - Vocabulary

examine: to check or study something carefully (verb)



When you are sick, the doctor will **examine** you to see what is wrong.

Hospitals - Vocabulary

bandage: a long, narrow piece of cloth that is tied around an injury (noun)



He cut his hand, so the nurse put a **bandage** on it.
