Dinosaur - Vocabulary

jaw: the lower part of your face that moves when you open your mouth (noun)



She can open her **jaw** really wide to sing loudly.

Dinosaur - Vocabulary

tear off: to remove something quickly and forcefully (phrasal verb)



The kids **tear off** the wrapping paper on Christmas morning.

Dinosaur - Vocabulary

agile: able to move quickly and easily in all directions
(adjective)



Cats are very **agile** and can jump high.


Dinosaur - Vocabulary

chomp: to chew or bite on something loudly or with a lot of force (verb)




You can hear the hippo **chomp** on its food.

Hunters from Long Ago

Millions of years ago, giant meat-eating dinosaurs ruled the land. Some were as long as a bus and as heavy as an elephant! They used their powerful jaws to grab prey and could chomp through bone with one loud bite. Imagine hearing that echo across a forest! Scientists study their fossils today because these ancient hunters teach us how animals survived in a dangerous world.

The Super Strong T-Rex

Tyrannosaurus Rex was one of the most powerful predators ever. Its teeth were as long as bananas, and they were thick and sharp. With one bite, it could tear off huge pieces of meat — almost 200 kilograms at once! That is heavier than two grown men. When it walked, the ground may have shaken under its feet, so smaller animals quickly ran away.

It is important to learn how to use proper verb tenses.

Present Simple: Used for regular actions or facts.

I **sometimes go** to the beach. (**regular action**)

Sharks **live** in the ocean. (**fact**)

Present Continuous: Used for actions happening now.

I **am busy cleaning** my house **at the moment**.

I **am taking** swimming lessons **this month**.

Past Simple: Used for actions that happened in the past.

I **studied** for 2 hours **last night**.
