Fashion - Vocabulary

style: the way someone dresses or does things that shows what they like (noun)



Max likes to wear comfortable clothes but has a very cool **style**.

Fashion - Vocabulary

outfit: A group of clothes that are worn together to look nice or to play (noun)



The kids wore their karate **outfits** to practice.

Fashion - Vocabulary

baggy: clothes that are too big and not tight-fitting
(adjective)



Her style is to wear really **baggy** outfits.

Fashion - Vocabulary

fit: to be the right size or shape for someone or something (verb)



She tried on the shoes to see if they would **fit** her feet well.

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
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Future with Going To

past (before now)




this morning
