# Restaurant - Vocabulary

**buffet:** a restaurant where guests serve themselves from many different foods (noun)



I like **buffets** because I can eat many different kinds of food.

# Restaurant - Vocabulary

**salad bar:** a section of a buffet where people can make their own salads with vegetables, fruits, and toppings (n)



I always go to the **salad bar** first so I can make a healthy salad.

# Restaurant - Vocabulary

**entree:** the main dish eaten at a meal (noun)



The **entree** was so big that I couldn't eat dessert.

# Restaurant - Vocabulary

**dessert:** a sweet dish served at the end of a meal (noun)



I love **dessert**, especially chocolate cake!

2. What would you do if food fell on the floor?





# Comparatives and Superlatives



comparative

A dog is faster than an elephant.

A comparative compares two things.

superlative

The horse is the fastest.

A superlative compares three or more.

# Comparatives and Superlatives

|              | adjective     | comparative              | superlative                 |
|--------------|---------------|--------------------------|-----------------------------|
| ONE Syllable | fast<br>young | -er<br>faster<br>younger | -est<br>fastest<br>youngest |

**Comparative** A dog is faster than an elephant.  
We use "**than**" when using a comparative.

**Superlative** The horse is the fastest.  
We use "**the**" when using a superlative.
